Morgans Regiment, Captain Longs Company Rifle Choir, Original declaration made April 21st 1820 Received a pension Certificate Numbered 4793 and I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818 and that I not since that time by gift sale or in any manner disposed of any property or any part thereof with intent thereby as to diminish as to being myself within the provisions of an act of Congress Entitled, enact to provide for certain person engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War passed on the 18th day of March 1818 cited that I have not nor has any person intrust for me, and property contracts securities, contracts as debts due me; nor have I any income other than what in contained in the Schedule herewith amended.
